## Year 1 Curriculum Overview - Term 3 2019

### English



In English this term, students will develop an understanding of the need to sequence a story using time words. They will then retell a familiar cultural story in their own words.

In daily writing, students will continue to learn how to write interesting sentences that start with a capital letter and end with a full stop. In reading lessons students will look at a variety of different reading strategies to decode unknown words, read fluently and with expression.

In handwriting lessons, students will be practising the correct formation of letters using an appropriate pencil grip.



### Mathematics

In Mathematics students will practise skip counting by twos, fives, and tens (forwards and backwards) to 100. They will solve simple addition and subtraction problems using MAB blocks and will write a matching number sentence using numbers to 50.

They will learn to tell the time to the half hour and describe the duration of time using minutes, days, months, and years.

Students will describe and recognise two-dimensional and three-dimension shapes.

They will measure the length of objects using informal units and compare the capacity of different containers. Students will identify and order money according to value.



### Science

In this unit, students will learn about how the needs of different animals are met from living within a specific habitat. They also learn that things can be living, non-living or once living. They will explore the external features of animals and plants.



### Technology

Students will design and make a puppet of a character using different materials. They will explain how they can make their puppet move.



### The Arts

In small groups, students will use iPads to create a digital retell of a dreamtime story using Media Arts techniques.

### Health & Physical Education

Junior Sports Day Training and students will identify social changes that occur as they grow older and recognise ways they can take some responsibility for their own safety.

### Gross Motor Program

Term Focus will be on object control throwing, catching and kicking.

### Humanities and Social Sciences



Students will investigate the different features of places, how we care for places and how spaces within a place can be rearranged to suit different purposes.
