Year 1 Curriculum Overview - Term 1, 2024

English

Students will explore diverse literature featuring recognisable characters and everyday events. They will engage in discussions about story elements like plot, character, and settings, drawing connections to their own experiences. Through writing, drawing, or digital tools, they will retell key events and share ideas with peers.

Humanities and Social Sciences

During HASS lessons, students will:

- develop an understanding of how their daily life has changed over time
- explore the terms past, present and future
- represent personal milestones on a timeline

Mathematics

Students will:

- Count to and from 100 and locate numbers on a number line.
- Continue simple patterns involving numbers and objects.
- Describe number sequences counting by twos, fives, and tens.
- Describe two-dimensional shapes.
- Recognise Australian coins according to their value.







The Arts

During Visual Art lessons, students will create a variety of pictures using different mediums. They will also sketch and paint four faces depicting The Zones of Regulation.



Health and Physical Education

In Physical Education, students will participate in balance/locomotor mini games. They will also participate in skill development for cross-country. In Health, students will learn who they are and what are their likes, interests and features. They will learn to sequence stages of life.

Science

In this unit, students will describe the observable features of a variety of landscapes and skies. They will consider changes in the sky and landscape, and the impact of these changes on themselves and other living things.

Digital Technologies

During this semester unit, students will collect and display data with meaning. They will learn how to represent simple data in different ways.
