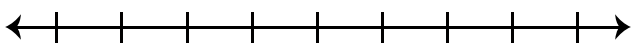

Mathematics

Students will continue to develop their skills in counting to and from 100 and locating these numbers on a number line. They will carry out simple addition and subtraction problems. Students will engage in activities involving collecting, drawing, and describing data, as well as making inferences based on the information gathered.



The Arts

In Dance, students will respond to different cultural dances. They will explore dance sequences using the elements of dance (space, time, dynamics, relationships).



Health and Physical Education

In Physical Education, students will participate in sports rotations that focus on hand-eye co-ordination, specifically ball control and throwing. In Health, students will recognise how strengths and achievements contribute to identity and identify how emotional responses impact on others' feelings.



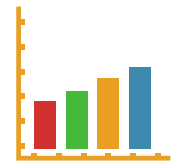
Science
