## Year 2P and 2R Curriculum Overview - Term 3, 2024



### English

Students will engage with a variety of texts, analysing how information is tailored to different types of texts to match their intended audience and purpose. They will also examine the use of persuasive language to convey opinions on texts and topics. Through discussions, independent writing and verbal expression, students will articulate their preferences effectively.



### Humanities and Social Sciences

Students will identify how and why the lives of people have changed over time while others have remained the same. They will compare objects from the past and present. Students will communicate findings in a range of texts using language to describe the passing of time.



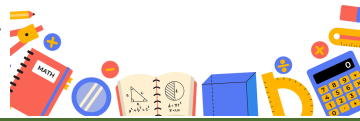

### Mathematics

In Mathematics, students will investigate and explore numbers to 1000. They will perform addition and subtraction calculations using a range of problem solving strategies. Students will continue to explore fractions dividing collections and shapes into halves, quarters and eighths. They will use a calendar to identify the date and the months included in seasons. Students will collect, organise and represent data to make simple inferences. They will also describe the outcomes for everyday events.



### The Arts

Students will engage in Dance. They will focus on cultural dancing linking with Harmony Day celebrations. Students will compare dances and explain the meaning/ purpose of each and how they are different.



### Digital Technologies

Students will collect, sort and organise information about their preferred holiday destination. Students will recognise and explore digital systems and their purpose.



### Science

Throughout this term, students will describe observable changes in day and night that occur as a result of Earth's rotation. They will illustrate changes, respond to questions, organise their thoughts and share observation. Students will use their understanding of the movement of Earth to explain changes in day/night and seasons.

### Health and Physical Education

Students will demonstrate fundamental movement skills and participate in loco-motor movement skills that includes striking a ball and using skipping ropes. They will develop skills for Junior Sports Day activities. In Health, they will explore health messages seen in advertising and how they can be used to make good decisions about health and wellbeing.
