Aspley East State School

Year 6 Curriculum Overview - Term 1, 2024



Students will engage with a variety of literary texts for enjoyment. They will explore the contexts in which texts were created and how authors represent ideas and events. Additionally, students will analyse author styles, the use of text structures, and language features, while identifying interpersonal relationships between characters. Furthermore, students will use a text as a model to innovate on and actively participate in discussions.



Mathematics

Students will recognise the properties of prime, composite, square and triangular numbers. They will develop an understanding on how to connect fractions, decimals and percentages. They will investigate, interpret and compare a variety of data displays. Students will also further develop problem solving strategies to solve word problems.



Science

In this unit students will explore the environmental conditions that affect the growth and survival of living things. They will plan and conduct fair tests and analyse the results of these tests.

Humanities and Social Sciences

Students will explain the significance of an event/development (Australian Federation) on an individual or group. They will identify changes and continuities for different groups in the past and present. Students will develop inquiry and research skills through structured questioning and sequencing information by creating timelines. They will investigate different points of view from the past and present.

The Arts

Students will investigate different Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander artworks from around Australia. They will explore influences such as resources, climate and traditions that reflect in their art.

Design Technologies

During this semester unit, students will investigate how electrical energy can control movement, sound or light in a designed product or system.
