- Implementation of revised pedagogical guidelines which reflect the updated Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Framework (CARF).
- Development of co-teaching model to provide reasonable, targeted and inclusive adjustments for SWD.

Employ a Wellbeing Champion for 1 day each week to support student and staff wellbeing across the school	<b>\$16,750</b>
Develop an coaching framework to support beginning and early career teachers in the Aspley East Pedagogical Framework	<b>\$50,250</b>
